

## Prayer news: November 2020

Thank you for joining with us in prayer for men and women affected by homelessness and poverty in these difficult days.

### City Centre

- A guest who regularly attends our daytime Drop-in is struggling with his mental health and he often talks of suicide. Please pray for breakthrough in his life, and pray for all of our guests who have been struggling with poor mental health during lockdown.
- A woman we know through Street Outreach was distressed when her dog was stolen. We prayed with her and heard last week that the dog had been found. Give thanks that she is now very open to prayer. Pray God's protection and guidance for our teams on Street Outreach as they offer friendship and support to people with multiple and complex needs.
- One of our Urban guests has been working hard for a qualification but, due to a communication error, was denied access to sit the test. We've helped put a plan in place for a second test. Please pray for him as he prepares to sit this and for a job opportunity to arise
- One of our guests recently suffered a sudden family bereavement. Please pray that they would know God's peace and comfort.

### Child and Family Centre, Govan

- Some of our groups are meeting outside in the park just now. As the weather changes this is becoming more challenging. Please pray that families would still engage with these groups and for wisdom for staff as we work with the regulations.
- We thank God that all the nursery children have settled in well. Pray for creativity, joy and wisdom for the staff as they plan for Christmas.
- One of our international families is waiting on news from the Home Office about their asylum application. Pray they will receive the right to remain and for patience in the waiting.
- One of our parents has been suffering from anxiety so please pray God's peace over her. Another has been undergoing medical tests. Please pray for quick test results.

### Overnight Welcome Centre

- Please pray for the team as they make the final preparations for the opening of the Overnight Welcome Centre on 1 December. This includes three intensive days of team training and liaising with partners.
- Pray that those who will be at risk of street homelessness this winter will be quickly found suitable accommodation and that numbers at the Overnight Welcome Centre will be low. Pray too for those who will stay, that they would feel cared for and valued and that as a partnership we would be able to support them to move onto suitable accommodation and receive support for all their needs.
